Being partners with the City of Lakewood in its Sustainable Neighborhood Program
(SNP) is a real honor. It is exciting to be working with Jonathan and Leslie as they pull
individuals, communities and neighborhoods together to educate and inform us of the
value of working collectively to make Lakewood and LLV a more vibrant and sustainable
place to live.

Not only does our work together meet many of the goals of your HOA and its Long
Range Planning Team, but most, if not all, of the Projects, Special Events, Workshops and
Implementations we put in place also ensure what we do is in sync with the
neighborhoods around us and with the City of Lakewood. Thus building a stronger and
more unified place to live and work.

Working with the City greatly improves our access to resources that can assist us in re-
fining and reaching our goals. Several of your SNP teams have already reached out to city
departments and regional utilities to move forward with the goals and plans you and your
neighbors have asked to be addressed.

Lastly, and certainly not least of all, the tangible and intangible ways this partnership
benefits LLV is it *ups* our game within the real estate market. We all want the value of our
homes to, at least, stay strong, but being known as a “Certified Sustainable” neighborhood
(which is well within our grasp– more on that later) can only help to push us toward the
top of the list of townhouse communities available in such a sought-after area as Lake-
wood.

Since being accepted into the SNP, your neighbors have created five standing commit-
tees to initially address the five key areas established by the SNP: Energy, Air, Water, Land
and, of course, People.

There are four other SNP communities within the city limits. All of these groups are
larger, and some much larger than our LLV group. Our LLV community is around 72 homes;
some of the other groups have over 3,000 homes represented. But overall we are all part
of a great beginning to a very important process.

It is our very strong hope that many of you within LLV (either owner or resident) will
see a team that you feel you can support and join. Or maybe you’ll sense a team that is
missing from our initial list! If so, speak up! We can have as many teams working as we can
support and will bring us closer to our goals.

Lake Lochwood Sustainable Neighborhood's Focus

All of these teams have had meetings and planning sessions since our beginning with Jonathan and the City this past June. In fact, most of the teams have had one or more events, activities or workshops over the past months. The listing and results of our actions (see them on the city's SNP website:

SustainableNeighborhoodNetwork.org) have already garnered our community 20 credits within the program. Well on our way to 60 credits for a "Participating Neighborhood" certification and then to the "Outstanding Neighborhood" certification when we reach 100 credits. At the outstanding level we will receive both signage and citywide recognition for our achievements. So, please join us in being part of the process of becoming a more sustainable community. RECYCLING & WATER CONSERVATION

Recycling mission: To inform and protect the health and safety of our community in regards to Recycling.

Projects

2013

This committee's introduction to LLV was held at our clubhouse in late summer. Eleven households were interested in 96 gallon recycle bins. Information was shared on the types of things that Republic Waste would pick up. A Blue Flag will be displayed on our mailbox kiosks one day prior to recycle pick up day.

In October, LLV's Recycling & Water Conservation team held a "Hazardous Materials" event to collect and properly dispose of those hazardous materials we all have piling up in our garages and basements. LLV residents were encouraged to bring any hazardous materials they wished to recycle to a central collection point in the community. Volunteers collected, loaded, and hauled the materials to the Rooney Road Recycling Center where recycling experts sorted and accepted them for proper disposal. A full truckload of old paint, cleaning materials, petroleum products and used electronics were delivered for recycling.

2014

Your Recycling team plans on hosting events like this throughout the year: Save up and join in! *Just as a reminder: Best Buy will take TVs, computers, printers, etc. at any time.

Water Conservation mission: To better understand our water usage and implication of more sustainable options for our future.

Projects

2013

Water usage here in LLV is historically our second largest monthly expense. In an effort to better understand how these areas contribute to our total water costs, we asked Denver Water (DW) to review our usage and systems. DW personnel were on site last October to run a preliminary water usage audit. A full audit wasn't possible at that time because our irrigation systems were closed down for winter. However, DW offered several recommendations which we hope to have in place so we can reschedule a full audit in late spring once the irrigation systems are running.

2014

Prior to a spring "startup", this committee plans to research suppliers/installers of flow meters and present a plan to the HOA to install them into our irrigation system (as recommended by DW) so after the system is opened we can have DW back out for a full and complete audit. The data gathered will help us make future water-use decisions and implement conservation measures where desirable and appropriate as decided by the community. Possible measures might encourage: xeriscaping in common areas, ways to reduce water consumption, research of government incentives for installing water efficient technologies in our homes.

Projects

2013

The initial activity planned was a rollicking good time on the dance floor. Suzie had a social interaction/group dynamic event otherwise known as "Square Dancing", complete with a professional caller (Bob Riggs) from Castle Rock.

The next activity from your Health & Wellness team was created by Judith Anderson, one of our resident health care professionals. She developed an exercise program that could be modified as needed for participants. We had ten neighbors who made the commitment to exercising in the swimming pool throughout the summer, meeting 3 times/week for an hour.

In mid-August Suzie had a very well attended introduction to a 7 week course on prevention and management of chronic disease, called Consortium for Older Adult Wellness/Living a Healthy Life with Chronic Conditions. One of the main goals for the participants was to learn to self-manage their health, lower health costs and develop realistic goals to cope with change. Bottom line; a healthy combination of laughter and brain-storming brought about learning to actively tackle some of the issues of aging and to see themselves take charge of their own well-being.

2014

Suzie's first project for 2014 is a neighborhood survey to learn what our neighbors consider to be important to them in regards to Health and Wellness.
