# What Goes Where?

#### **Aluminum Cans**

Place in plastic rollable bins

aluminum beverage cans

(No food residue, cat food cans, aluminum foil, tins, or steel cans)

#### Glass

Place in rolloff marked for glass

glass bottles and jars

(No food residue, metal lids, mirrors, plate glass or light bulbs)

#### **Plastic** (#1-5 and #7)

Place in rolloff marked for plastics

- plastic bottles with caps half-way screwed on
- plastic food tubs and lids
- clamshells (for berries, lettuce)
- waxed milk cartons
- waxed juice boxes

(No food residue, buckets, Styrofoam or Plastic #6, frozen dinner plates, prescription bottles, trash cans, or lawn furniture)

#### **Not Recyclable\***

- Styrofoam (Plastic #6)
- plastic bags and wrap
- bags containing recyclables
- trash
- electronic devices
- hazardous materials and chemicals
- compressed gas tanks, propane tanks, aerosol cans

#### Paper

*Place in rolloff marked for paper* 

- shredded paper in clear plastic bags
- newspaper with inserts
- paperboard (cereal boxes, mac and cheese boxes, etc.)
- white and colored paper
- wrapping paper (not foil-lined)
- hard- and soft-cover books
- magazines and catalogs
- phone books
- junk mail
- envelopes with and without film windows
- brochures, pamphlets
- shiny-coated paper
- carbonless receipts
- post-it notes
- manuals with glue bindings
- file folders with plastic tabs
- paper with staples, paperclips, binder clips
- food-soiled anything
- food or organic waste
- waxed paper and waxed cardboard
- wet or soiled paper and paper products
- carpet or cloth
- any light bulbs
- liquids
- mirrors, window glass, plates, dishes and glasses

#### Cardboard

Place on tables next to shed

 flattened corrugated cardboard

(No food residue or wet cardboard)

### **Scrap Metal**

Place in rolloff marked for scrap metal

- aluminum (foil, pie plates, etc.)
- metal lids
- steel cans (for soup, fruit, etc.)
- tin cans
- steel
- stainless steel
- iron, cast iron
- lead
- copper
- zinc
- brass
- alloys
- appliances and above materials not containing hazardous chemicals and are more than 50% metal and are items that residents can place in the rolloffs without assistance

#### (No refrigerators,

microwaves, electronics, aerosol cans, propane or compressed gas cylinders, drums, munitions, bullets, military range scrap, fluorescent bulbs or ballasts, turnings, borings, oily scrap, radioactive/ hazardous waste/chemicals)
